In 1910, Wali-Allah married Bahiya 'Ata'i, daughter of Sani'-al-Soltan Mirza 'Ata'-Allah 'Ata'i. The couple had ten children, seven of whom survived. The eldest child, 'Ali-Mohammad Varqa (b. Tehran, 1 January 1912; d. Haifa, 22 September 2007), became the last Hand of the Cause of God, and Chief Trustee of Hoqoq-Allah, having been invested with this dual responsibility by Shoghi Effendi in 1955 upon the passing of his father, Wali-Allah (Baha'i World XIII, p. 831; Shoghi Effendi, 1971, p. 173).

When 'Abd-al-Baha' embarked on his historic journey from the Holy Land to the West in 1912, Wali-Allah Varqa was invited to join the accompanying party as a translator, and he traveled in their company to North America, London, and Paris. He returned to Tehran from Europe and became employed first as a secretary at the Russian legation, and later as first secretary at the Turkish embassy. At the start of World War II, Wali-Allah resigned from his post at the Turkish embassy to dedicate his time to the affairs of the Baha'i faith.

After his return to his native Iran from the journey to the West, Wali-Allah served on the Local Spiritual Assembly (Mahfel-e ruhani) of the Baha'is of Tehran, and subsequently on the National Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of Iran until the end of his life. In 1953, he attended Baha'i Intercontinental Conferences in Kampala, Chicago, Stockholm, and New Delhi (Baha'i World XIII, p. 381), in between visiting Baha'i communities in Central and South America, Belgium, Holland, Germany, Italy, Iraq, Egypt, Syria, and Turkey. He made his last pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 1954. He passed away in Tubingen and was buried in Stuttgart, Germany (Kušaha, 1994).
